Students engage in simple interactions to provide and obtain information using single words or learned phrases.

- a. Use culturally-appropriate and age-appropriate courtesy expressions.
 - b. Participate in brief guided exchanges related to likes and dislikes.
 - c. Make age-appropriate introductions of classmates, family members, and friends.
 - d. Ask and answer simple learned questions.
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A2 Interpretive

Students comprehend and respond to simple spoken/signed language in a classroom setting.

- a. Respond to simple oral/signed directions, commands, and routine requests in the classroom.
 - b. Identify people and objects based on oral/signed descriptions.
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A3 Presentational

Students use memorized words or phrases and visuals in short oral/signed presentations.

- a. Provide simple descriptions of people, places, and objects.

- b. Recognize cultural differences including dress, mealtime practices, gestures, and/or celebrations.
