Demonstrates competency in a variety of motor skills and movement patterns.

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- 3. Dribbles and travels in general space at slow to moderate jogging speed with control of ball and body. S1.E17.3**

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- 3. Passes and receives a ball with the inside of the foot to a stationary partner, "giving" on reception before returning the pass. S1.E19.3**
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- a. Uses a continuous running approach and intentionally performs a kick along the ground and a kick in the air, demonstrating four of the five critical elements of a mature pattern for each. S1.E21.3.A**
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- b. Uses a continuous running approach and kicks a stationary ball for accuracy. S1.E21.3.B**
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- 3. Volleys an object with an underhand or sidearm striking pattern, sending it forward over a net, to the wall or over a line to a partner, while demonstrating four of the five critical elements of a mature pattern. S1.E22.3**
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- a. Strikes an object with a short-handled implement, sending it forward over a low net or to a wall. S1.E24.3.A**
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- b. Strikes an object with a short-handled implement while demonstrating three of the five critical elements of a mature pattern. S1.E24.3.B**
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- 3. Strikes a ball with a long-handled implement, sending it forward, while using proper grip for the implement (e.g., hockey stick, bat, golf club). S1.E25.3**
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- 3. Performs intermediate jump-rope skills (e.g., a variety of tricks, running in and out of long rope) for both long and short ropes. S1.E27.3**
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Applies knowledge of concepts, principles, strategies and tactics related to movement and performance.
