General requirements.
This course is recommended for students in Grades 9-12. Students shall be awarded one credit for successful completion of this course. **A**

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Introduction. **B**

1 Career technical education instruction provides content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills for students to further their education and succeed in current or emerging professions. **B.1**

2 The Human Services Career Cluster focuses on preparing individuals for employment in career pathways that relate to families and human needs such as counseling and mental health services, family and community services, personal care services, and consumer services. **B.2**

3 Principles of Human Services is a laboratory course that will enable students to investigate careers in the Human Services Career Cluster, including counseling and mental health, early childhood development, family and community, personal care, and consumer services. Each student is expected to complete the knowledge and skills essential for success in high-skill, high-wage, or high-demand human services careers. **B.3**

4 Students are encouraged to participate in extended learning experiences such as career and technical student organizations and other leadership or extracurricular organizations. **B.4**

- C analyze the multiple roles and responsibilities assumed by individuals within the family; C.6.C
- D investigate community service opportunities; C.6.D
- E analyze dietary practices across the life span; C.6.E
- F explain the impact of nutrition on development, wellness, and productivity over the life span; C.6.F
- G prepare nutritious snacks or meals that contribute to wellness and productivity through the life span; C.6.G
- H describe rewards, demands, and future trends in family and community services; and C.6.H
- I identify employment and entrepreneurial opportunities and preparation requirements in the areas of personal interest. C.6.I

- B analyze apparel selection practices that accommodate personal needs, including age, lifestyle, special needs, and career; C.7.B
- C interpret and use information on apparel care labels; C.7.C
- D demonstrate safety practices when using and caring for apparel construction tools and equipment; C.7.D
- E demonstrate simple clothing repair and alteration techniques; C.7.E
- F describe rewards, demands, and future trends in fashion design; and C.7.F
- G identify employment and entrepreneurial opportunities and preparation requirements in the areas of personal interest. C.7.G

- A describe priorities and needs that influence interior design decisions; C.8.A
- B identify the elements and principles of design used in interiors; C.8.B
- C describe safe use and care of interior furnishings and equipment; C.8.C
- D identify maintenance and safety practices that affect interiors; C.8.D
- E discuss cultural, demographic, societal, and economic factors that influence interior design trends; C.8.E
- F describe rewards, demands, and future trends in interior design; and C.8.F
- G identify employment and entrepreneurial opportunities and preparation requirements in the areas of personal interest. C.8.G
